## Artistic Biography – **Jacek Magrys**

Jacek Magrys (born March 28, 1958, in Tarnów, Poland) is a painter and building technician whose artistic journey reflects a lifelong dedication to art, enriched by diverse cultural and professional experiences.

From an early age, Jack Magrys displayed remarkable artistic talent. He participated in national painting competitions, including those organized by the renowned radio broadcaster Szymon Kobyliński, winning twice and receiving book prizes for his work. During his military service, he continued to develop his skills, competing in art contests with military themes and earning several top awards, consistently demonstrating both technical precision and creative sensitivity.

Until 1988, he worked in Poland in the construction industry as a site manager, where his professional discipline complemented his artistic pursuits. In that year, he emigrated to Greece, spending three formative years there. During this period, he produced a series of works that were well received by the local artistic community, marking a significant expansion of his creative vision.

In 1991, Magrys moved to Canada, where he continued to evolve as an artist. In Toronto, he presented an exhibition of his paintings at the Woodbine Racetrack, offering works that combined European artistic traditions with fresh inspirations drawn from life abroad.

Magrys specializes in painting nature and horses, working primarily in pastel and oil, capturing the dynamic movement, character, and beauty of his subjects with sensitivity and mastery of technique. His paintings reflect a deep engagement with form, color, and emotional expression, bridging his personal experiences with universal aesthetic values.
